

## Equity Centered Capital Investment Plan

Each park is given an objective numerical score based on the combination of its park characteristics and community characteristics. Community characteristic scores are calculated at the neighborhood scale, and each park within a census tract will receive the same score. The park characteristics score is unique for each park based on the assets and physical needs of the individual park. For example, Beachwood & Kruse Park will receive the same community characteristic score because they lie in the same neighborhood or census tract, but they will receive different park characteristics scores based on the unique features that are physically located within each park.

Parks with high scores are prioritized in the master plan, but it's important to consider this is one of multiple tools used to guide us in our master planning efforts. Having a low score does not put the park in a negative category, but having a high score is a red flag for decision makers that improvements must be made at these locations.
