

Weybourne Road (B3307) Monkton Lane junction, Farnham – Pedestrian Improvements

STATEMENT OF REASONS

Following a Road Safety Outside Schools Assessment, the below proposed measure has been recommended to improve the road safety along Weybourne Road:

Proposed Road Table

Raised road table extending across the full width of the carriageway across B3007 Weybourne Road with 1.5m ramps and height of 75mm. Ramps to have a 1 in 20 gradient.

The centre of the proposed road table will be centred 23m southwest from the centre of Monkton Lane.

Road Table

7.5m flat top road table, 10.5m in total length

75mm Height

1:20 Gradient Ramps (1.5m length)

Reasoning

This scheme aims to create a safer crossing point along Weybourne Road. The benefits include:

- **Improved Road Safety:** Physical measure to reduce vehicle speeds, lowering the risk and severity of collisions
- **Encourages Active Travel:** Safer conditions promote more walking and cycling to adjacent schools and local amenities, reducing congestion and emissions
- **Enhanced Driver Awareness:** Traffic calming highlights the presence of a crossing point encouraging more cautious driving
- **Environmental Benefits:** Lower speeds can contribute to reduced noise and improved air quality.

The above proposal will be advertised in the local press (The Surrey Advertiser). County and Borough Councillors, Stakeholders and the Police will be consulted.
