

RAISED SIGNALISED PEDESTRIAN CROSSING IN B2031, CHALDON ROAD, STATEMENT OF REASONS

For some time, parents have been raising concerns about safety when crossing Chaldon Road to access Clifton Hill School (SEND)

A comprehensive assessment of safety was undertaken in 2024 and the following measures were recommended as part of our Road Safety Outside Schools programme.

- **Raised Signal-Controlled Pedestrian Crossing on B2031 Chaldon Road , Caterham**

The Crossing will be centred on a new raised table and will be 4m wide. The centre line of the proposed crossing and road table will be located 23m from the centreline of Heath Road.

The road Table will extend the full width of the carriageway, will be 10.5m long with 1.5m ramps and a height of 75mm.

Ramps to have 1 in 20 gradient

Reasoning

The infrastructure improvements are to support children and young adults from a Special Needs School, crossing Chaldon Road to access both Clifton Hill School and the church facilities opposite.

The students have diverse needs; many are visually or physically impaired or have profound learning difficulties.

A signalised crossing provides a clearer indication of when it is safe to cross, enabling students to become more independent when walking between the school and the church.

The above proposal will be advertised in the local press (The Surrey Advertiser) County and Borough Councillors, Stakeholders and the Police will be consulted.
