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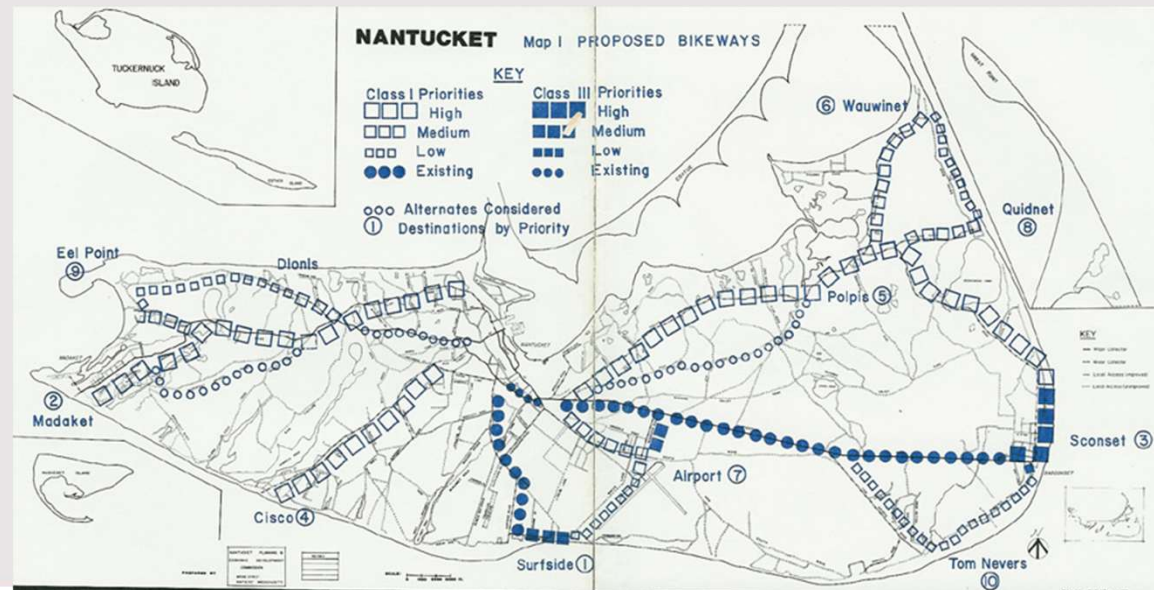

Background

- Recommended in the 1977 Nantucket Bikeway Master Plan
- Federal Land Access Program (FLAP) Grant funding - \$2.4 million
- Local funding – 2023 Annual Town Meeting (\$4.6 million)
- Preliminary Design Phase
 - Alignment Alternatives
 - Initial Stakeholder Consultation
 - Field Survey
 - Environmental Survey
 - Cultural Survey



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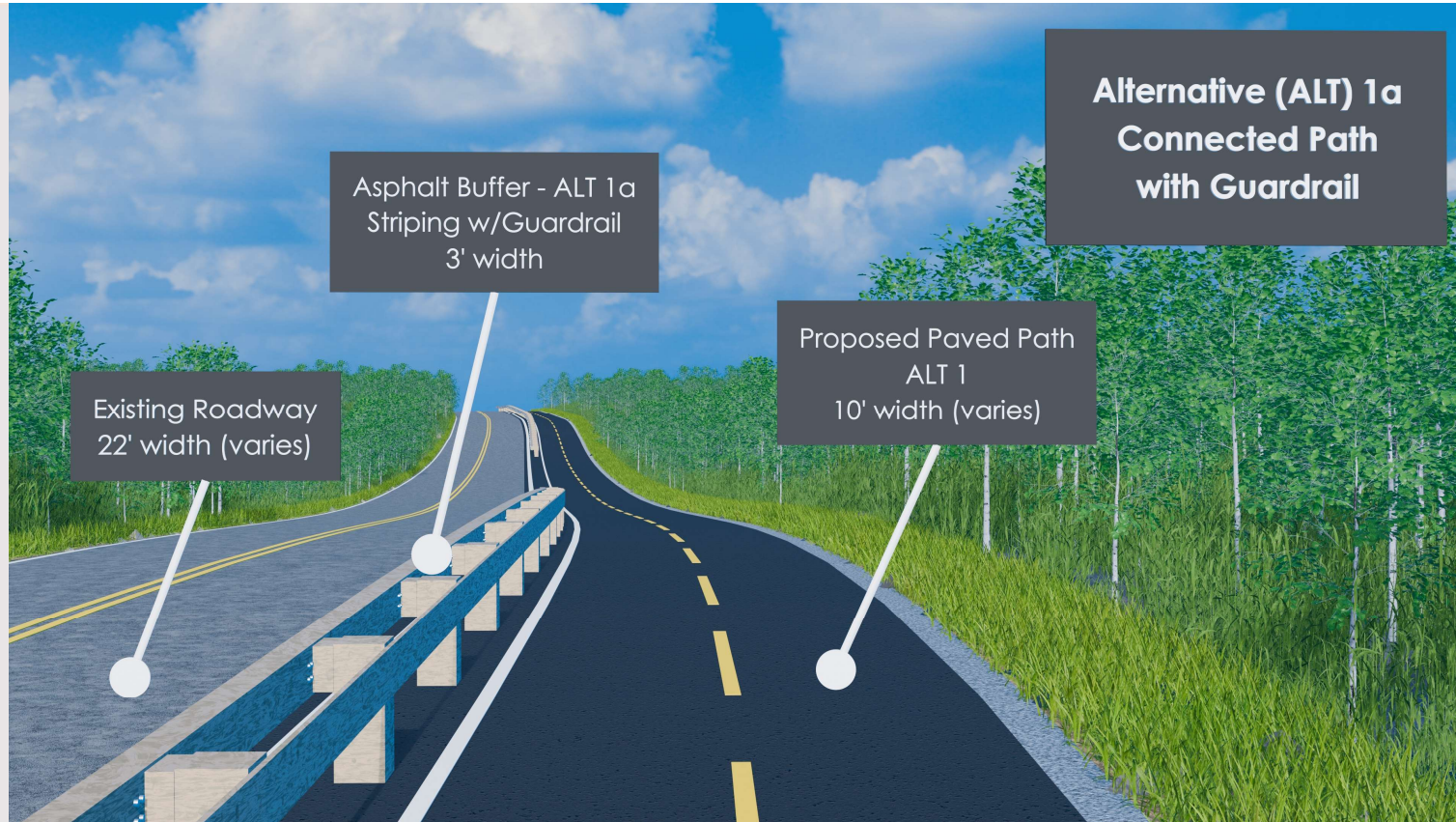


Alignment Alternatives

- **Section A**
 - From Polpis Rd to Eat Fire Springs
- **Section B**
 - From Eat Fire Springs to Medouie Creek Rd
- **Section C**
 - From Medouie Creek Rd to Pocomo
- **Section D**
 - From Pocomo to Squam Brook
- **Section E**
 - From Squam Brook to Approximately 2 miles from Project Start
- **Section F**
 - From Approximately 2 miles from Project Start to Project End



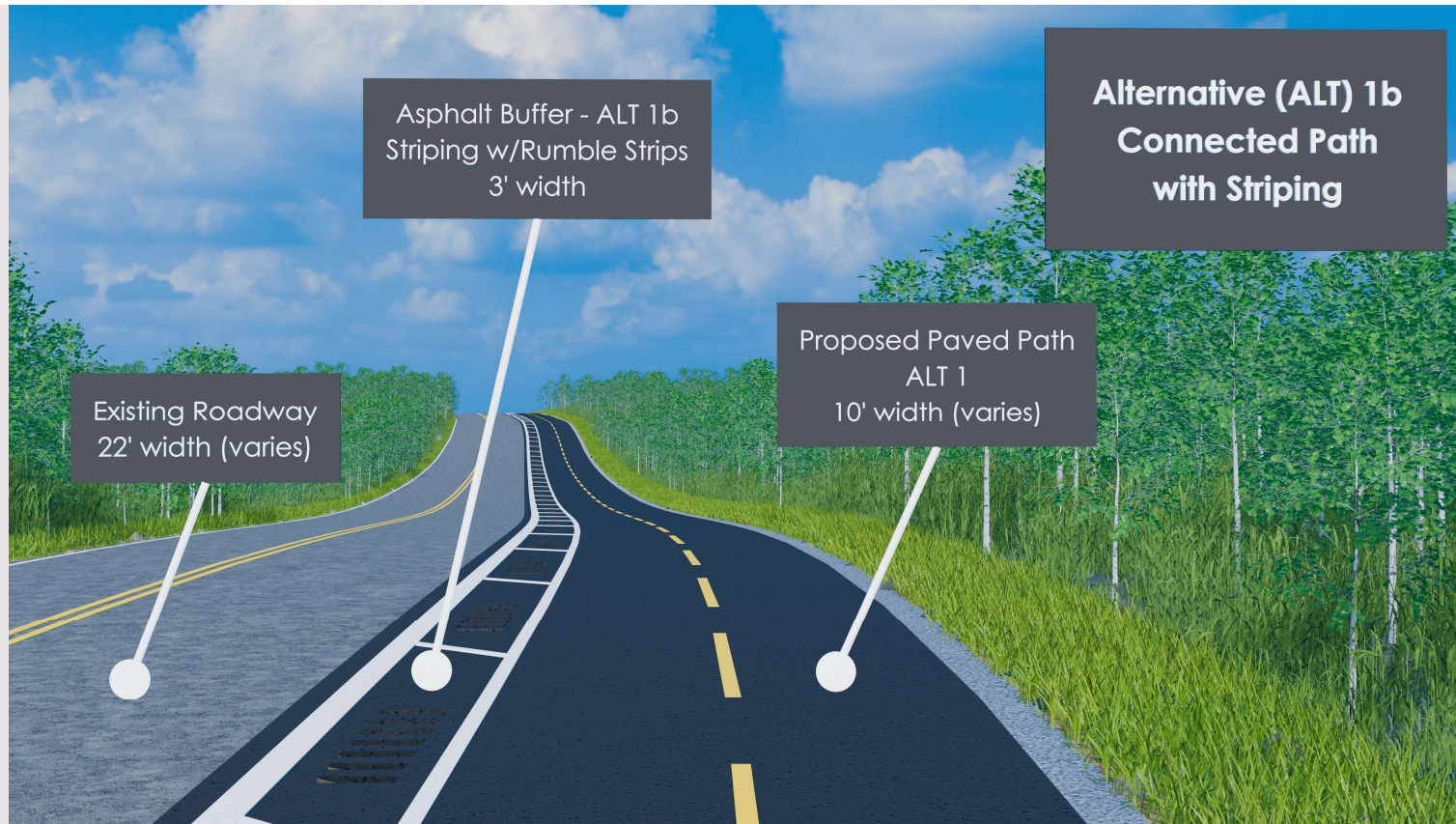
Cross Sections – Alternative 1 (Guardrail)

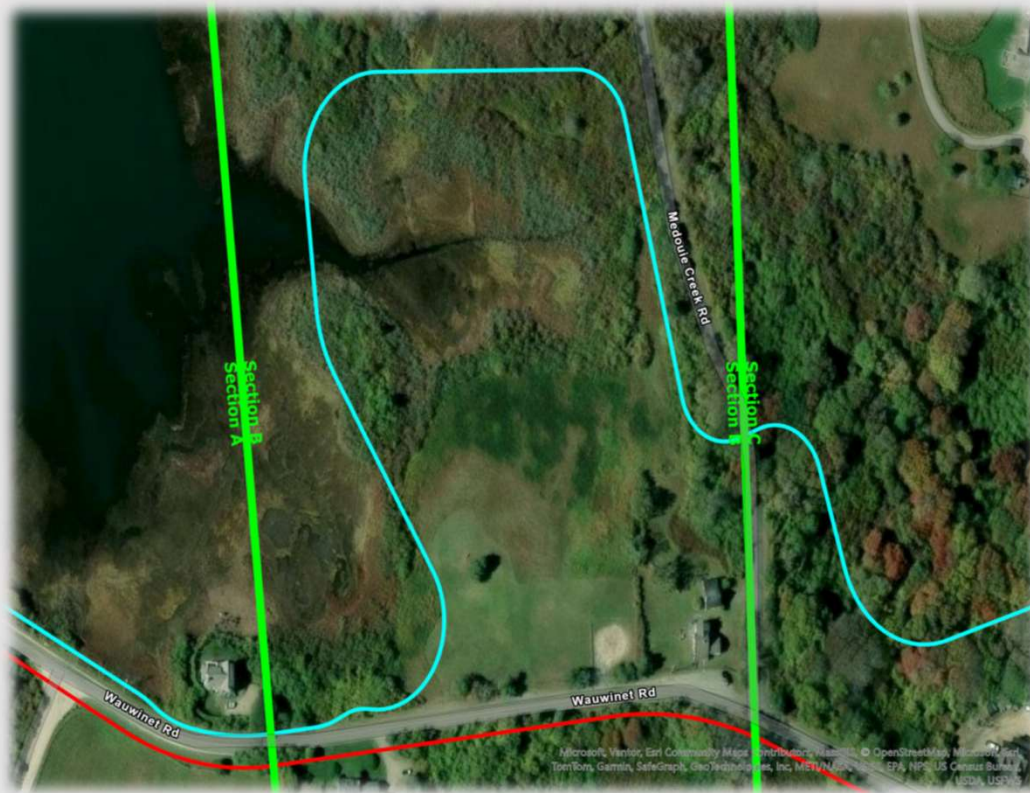
- Section A

- Alternative 2 (Cyan)



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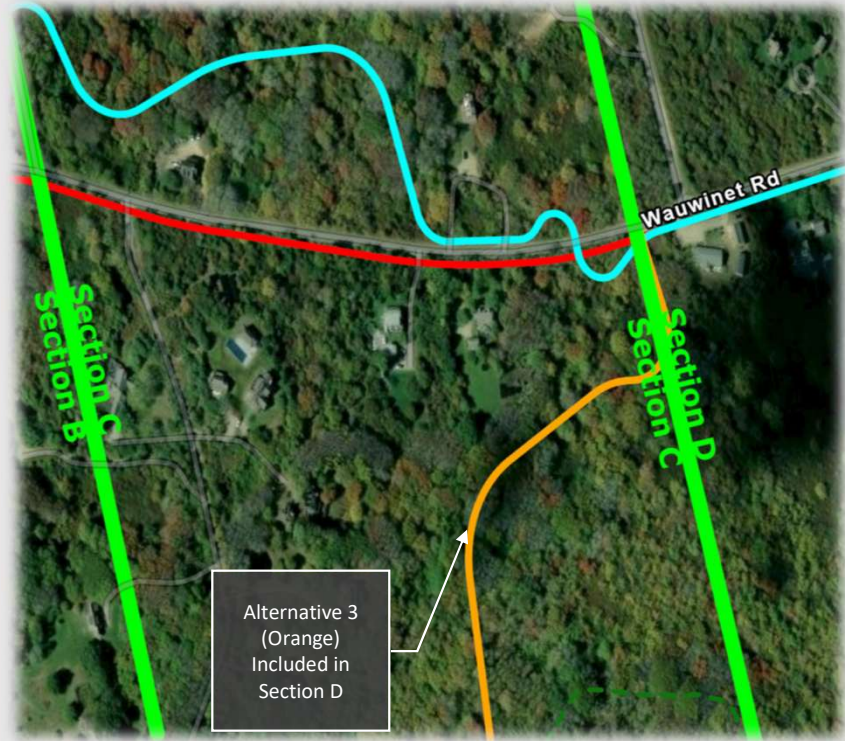
Alignment Alternatives – Section B

 - Approximately 0.3 miles
- Alternative 1 (Red)
- Alternative 2 (Cyan)
- *Alternative 3 (Orange) included in Section D*

- Section D
 - From Pocomo to Squam Brook
 - Approximately 0.5 miles
- Alternative 1 (Red)
- Alternative 2 (Cyan)
- Alternative 3 (Orange)



Alignment Alternatives – Section E



- Section E
 - From Squam Brook to Approximately 2 miles from Project Start
 - Approximately 0.4 miles
- Alternative 1 (Red)
- Alternative 2 (Cyan)
- Alternative 3 (Orange)
 - Merges with Alternative 4
- Alternative 4 (Purple)

Alignment Alternatives – Section F



- Section F
 - From Approximately 2 miles from Project Start to Project End
 - Approximately 0.3 miles
- Alternative 1 (Red)
- Alternative 2, 3, 4 (Purple)

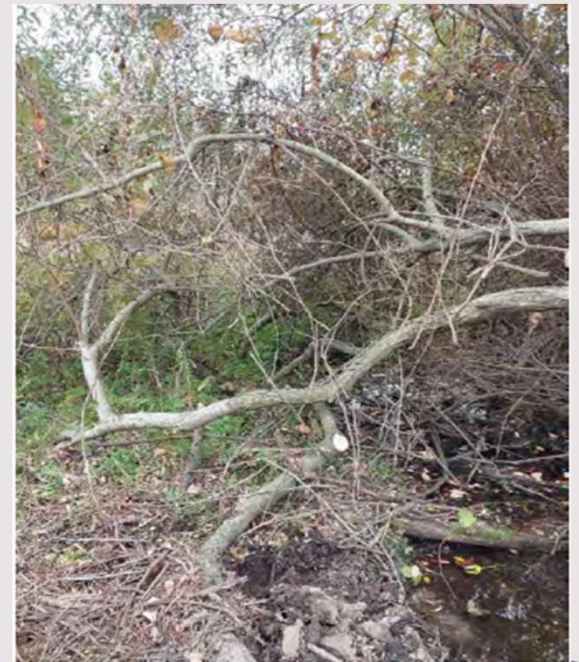
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Environmental Restrictions

Wetlands and Waters of the US/State

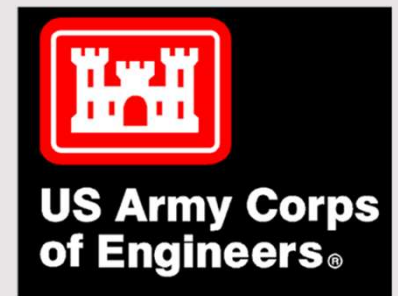
- National wetland inventory data was reviewed at a broad level for all alternatives;
- A wetland delineation in September 2025 in a study area adjacent to the roadway;
- 5 wetlands were identified (0.15 acres)
 - 3 Freshwater Emergent Wetlands
 - 2 Freshwater Forested/Shrub Wetlands



Environmental Restrictions

Next Steps

- Evaluate the impact to wetlands and waters of US/State
- Determine if mitigation is required; define that mitigation and prepare a mitigation plan
- Obtain Clean Water Act 404 and 401 permits from federal and state agencies



Environmental Restrictions

Biological Resources

- Research and site surveys in September 2025 to identify special status species have the potential to occur in the study area
- Initial search identified 6 federal species and 20 state species
- Survey along the alignments adjacent to the roadway identified suitable habitat
 - 5 Federal Species
 - 9 State Species

Next Steps

- Coordinate with Federal and State Agencies
- Finalize the biological assessment
- Consult with USFWS under Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act



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Cultural Restrictions

- Significant historical properties are categorized by their eligibility or their potential eligibility for listing on the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP)
- Research and pedestrian survey of the alignments adjacent to the roadway was performed
 - Conducted in December 2025

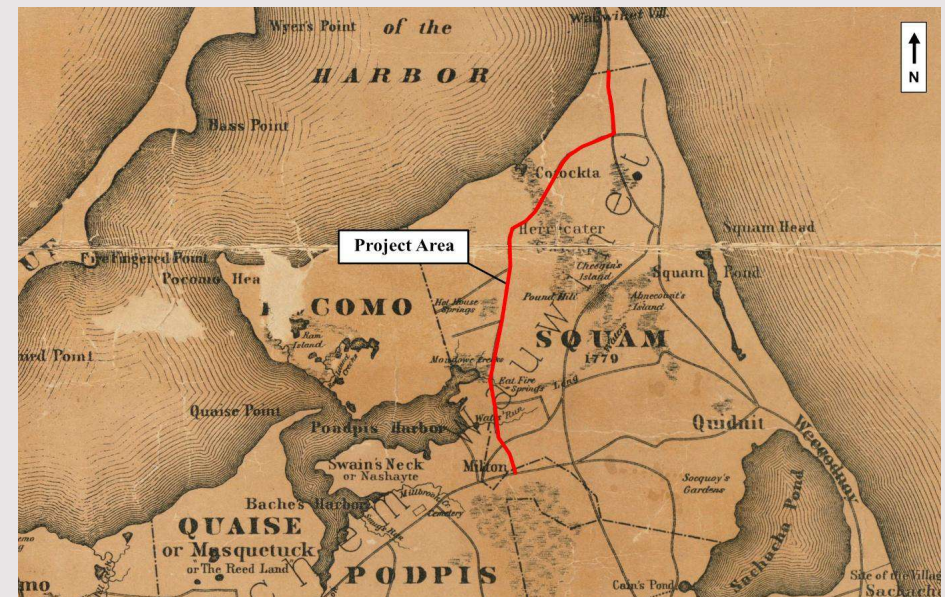
- Properties determined to be ineligible for listing

Cultural Restrictions

Archeological Resources

- On-going coordination with MAHC
- Pedestrian survey performed
- Assess the potential for buried resources
 - High, Moderate and Low
- An intensive level survey will be performed after an alternative is chosen

Cultural Restrictions

Next Steps

- Perform intensive level archeological survey
- Assess potential impacts, including visual impacts
- Prepare a cultural resources inventory report
- FHWA will consult with tribes
- FHWA will consult with MAHC under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act / Local historical commission

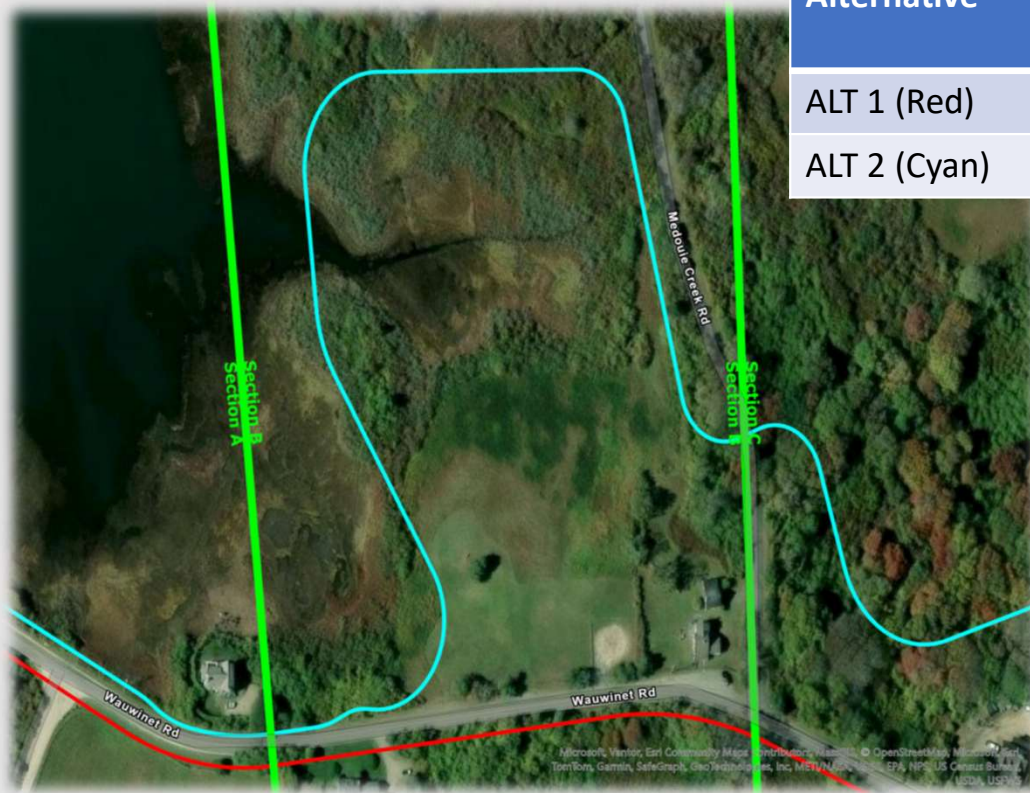

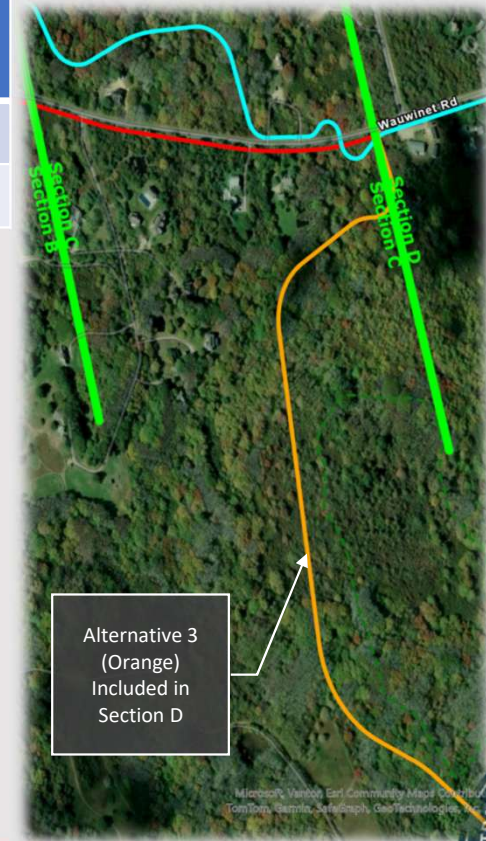

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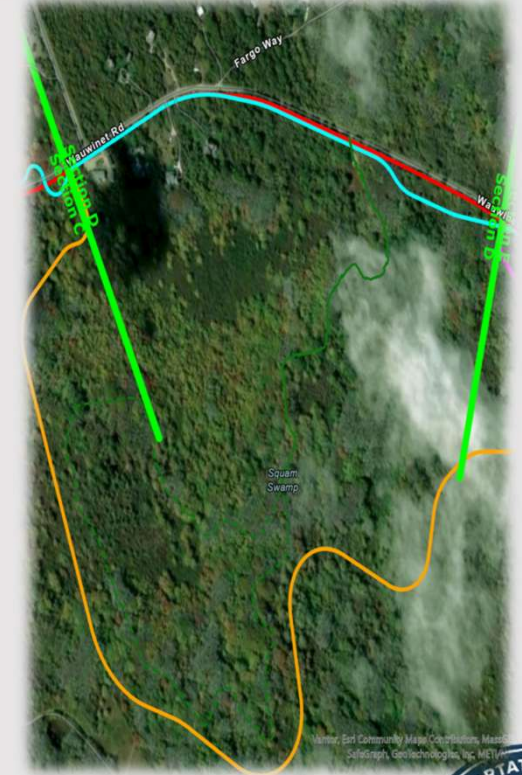

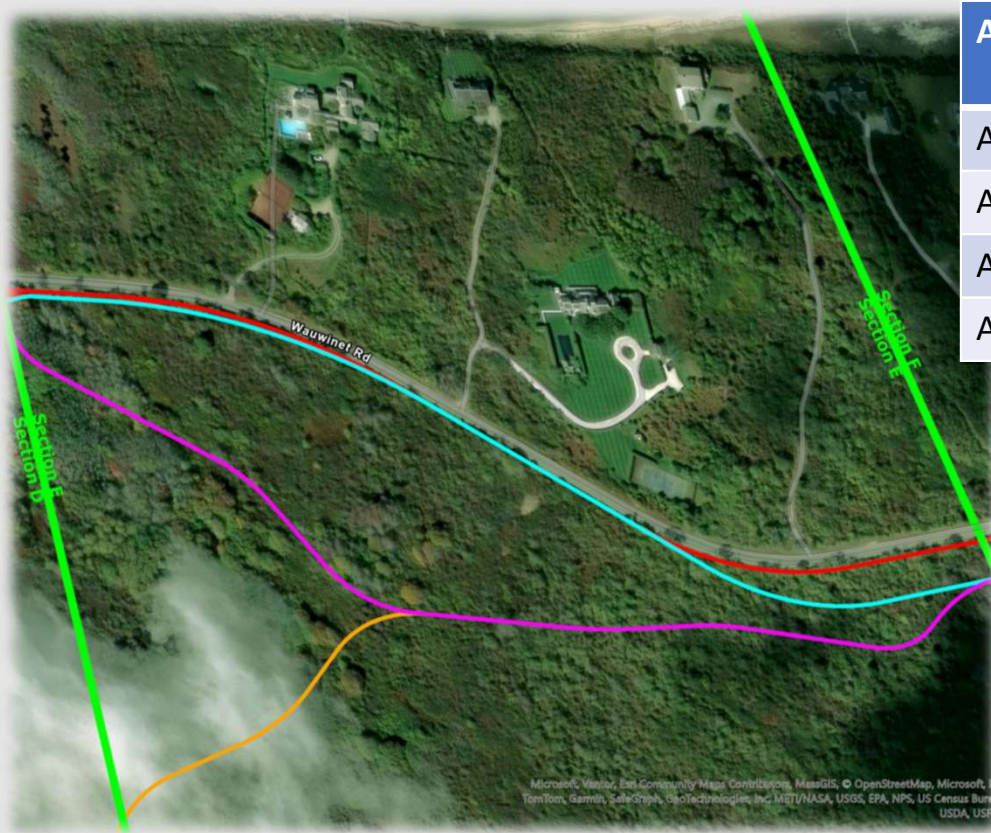

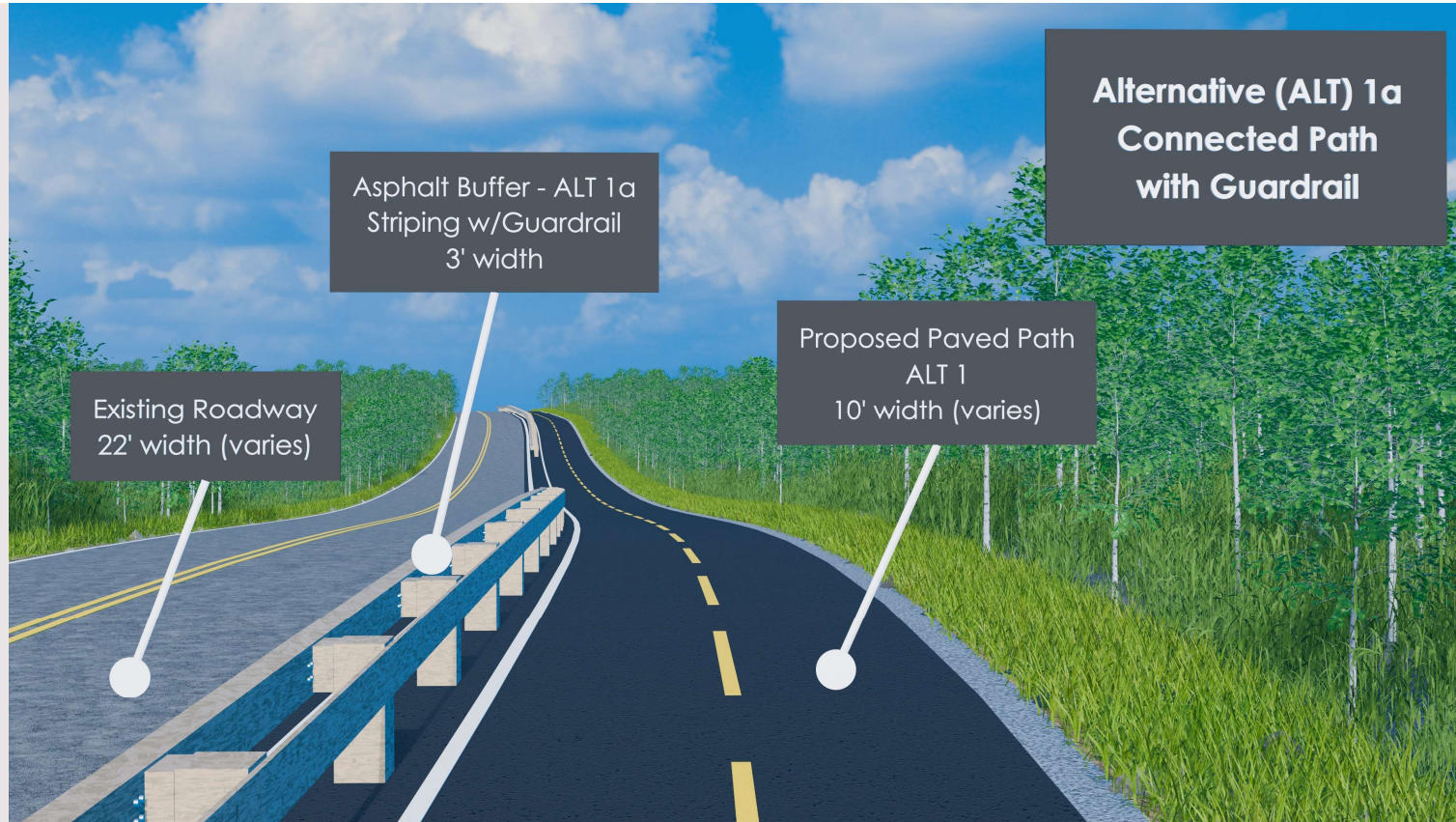

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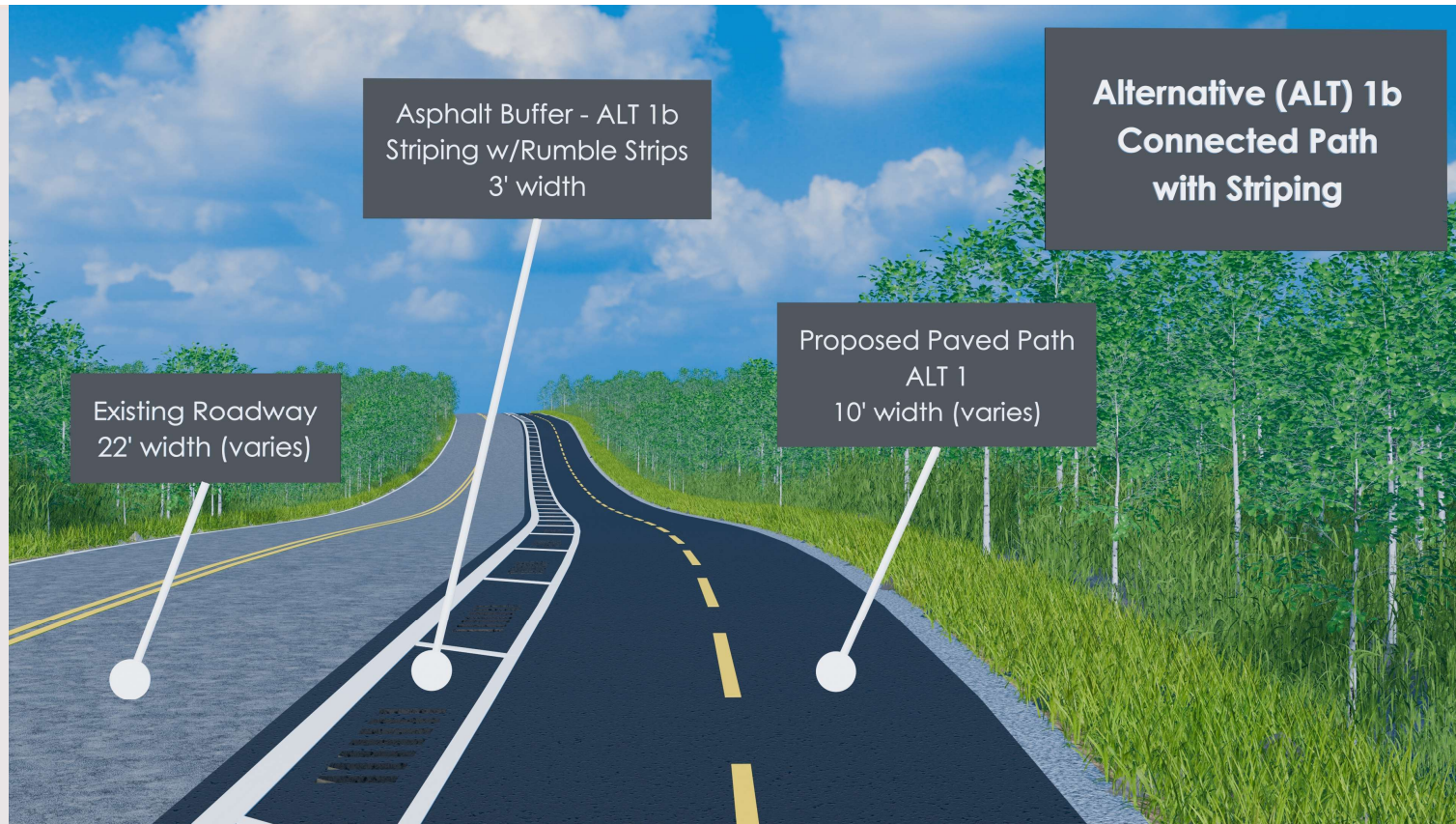

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Next Steps

- August 12, 2026 – Presentation of Alignment Alternatives and Impacts
- August / September – Advisory Committees Develop Recommendations
- September/October 2026 – County Commissioners Approve Alignment
- 2026 – 2028 –
 - FHWA Design Team to develop Preliminary Plans for Permitting
 - Secure Permitting and Right of Way
 - Finalize Design Plans
- Spring 2029 – Anticipated Start of Construction (dependent on permitting)
