Executive Summary

Key Insights

- In Q1 2026, 51% of residents expressed satisfaction with **overall quality of life** in Pasco County, up 3 ppt from the previous cycle. This remains significantly **below both the cohort (70%) and national (67%) averages** - a gap of 19 ppt and 16 ppt respectively. **Likelihood to recommend** Pasco County as a place to live scored 45%, 19 ppt below the national average (64%) and 24 ppt below cohort (69%).
- **District-level results** show meaningful divergence: **District 2 leads** at 68% satisfaction (17 ppt above the county average), while District 5 trails at 41% (10 ppt below the county average). **District 1 saw the largest improvement this cycle**, rising 8 ppt to 55%, and District 4 improved 7 ppt to 52%, while District 3 declined 5 ppt to 45%.
- The 37% neutral share on overall quality of life indicates that more than one in three residents are undecided, **representing a meaningful pool that targeted service improvements could move in a positive direction.**

Strategic Plan Focus

1: Create a Thriving Community - Provide a Sustainable Foundation for Health, Safety, Mobility:

1.1 Improve the capacity and capability of emergency service response.

- **Sense of overall safety scored 47% satisfaction this cycle**, 21 ppt below the cohort (68%) and 15 ppt below the national (62%) averages. A 29% neutral share signals **meaningful potential for upward movement**: with nearly one in three residents undecided, targeted investments in emergency and public safety response capacity could shift perceptions significantly. Open-text responses cited Safety among the top topics residents want addressed.

1.2 Protect vulnerable critical assets and communities from extreme conditions:

- **County's efforts to protect vulnerable assets** and neighborhoods from extreme weather or environmental conditions scored **37% satisfaction**, up 3 ppt from the previous cycle. Improvement was concentrated in **Districts 2 and 4**. When asked to identify the county's single most important action, 41% of residents prioritized **upgrading drainage, stormwater, or flood control systems**, followed by **expanding tree canopy and green infrastructure** and **improving emergency preparedness and evacuation planning**.

1.3 Complete revisions to the Comprehensive Plan (Comp Plan) and expeditiously update priority portions of the Land Development Code (LDC):

- **Ease of the permit and zoning process scored 33% satisfaction**, up **5 ppt** from the prior cycle - the largest positive change of any metric in the report - though it remains **11 ppt below both the cohort and national averages (44% each)**. Ease of getting around by public transportation scored **30%, 9 ppt below cohort (39%)** and **14 ppt below national (44%)**, indicating that mobility remains a low-satisfaction dimension worth tracking as LDC and Comp Plan updates proceed. On housing types residents would like to see added, **34% prefer smaller single-family homes**, the clear top preference over townhomes, apartments, or larger single-family homes.

2: Enhance Quality of Life - Provide Equitable Human Services, Social, Cultural and Recreational Opportunities for All

2.1 Make homelessness rare, brief and non-recurrent:

- Residents were asked about **homelessness** in this cycle's rotating section. When asked the best way for local businesses, residents, and government to work together, **34%** identified more **funding for housing and services** as the top approach, followed by **24%** who cited **job training and employment programs**. On program and policy priorities, **42%** of residents supported **behavioral health and substance abuse treatment** and **41%** supported **workforce development and job placement**, while **31%** supported **permanent supportive housing**. Open-text responses on service improvement also listed "Assist Homeless" as the leading subtopic under Public Services, reinforcing that residents see this as an area where **county action is needed and expected**.

2.2 Increase availability and access to cultural, educational, recreational and social opportunities for all:

- Four metrics fall under this initiative. **Quality of the library system** scored **58% satisfaction** - the highest-rated characteristic in the report - and quality of **parks and recreational amenities** scored **55%**, though both remain below national and cohort averages. **Access to quality education** scored **45%**, **16 ppt below national (61%)** and **15 ppt below cohort (60%)**, while availability of a variety of **art and cultural events** scored **31%** (**21 ppt below national, 23 ppt below cohort**). **Sense of community** scored **42%** (+3 ppt), with significant gains in **District 4 (+13 ppt to 47%)** and **District 1 (+8 ppt to 49%)** but a 5-ppt decline in **District 5 to 32%**; **Black or African American residents** scored **50%**, 8 ppt above the county average. When asked the most important community action, **32% of residents prioritized creating or investing in public spaces** such as parks, libraries, and community centers.

2.3 Ensure protection and conservation of natural ecosystems:

- **Pasco County's efforts to protect and conserve its natural ecosystems** (wetlands, rivers, and wildlife habitats) scored **36%** satisfaction, with **39% of residents responding negatively** - one of the higher negative-response rates in the report. With more than one in three residents actively dissatisfied, ecosystem stewardship communications and visible conservation outcomes would likely support improvement on this metric.

3: Drive Economic Growth and Prosperity - Support a Sustainable Increase in Community Income and Investment, Economic Diversification and Expanded Opportunities for All

3.1 Increase affordable housing/3.2 Support the redevelopment of stressed communities:

- **Availability of affordable housing** scored **28%** satisfaction — 9 ppt below both the national (**37%**) and cohort (**37%**) averages. On **housing development priorities**, residents most supported **emergency rent/mortgage assistance** for those facing eviction or foreclosure and **increased funding for repair and improvements** to owner-occupied homes, followed by **funding for new affordable housing development**. The change matrix shows jobs satisfaction improved **4 ppt** this cycle - with a **+9 ppt** gain in District 4. However, Black or African American residents saw an 8-ppt decline on this metric.

3.3 Increase support small business and entrepreneurship:

- Availability of **jobs that pay a living wage** scored **24% satisfaction** - the lowest-scoring characteristic in the report, **14 ppt below national (38%)** and **13 ppt below cohort (37%)**. Black or African American residents declined **8 ppt** on this metric. **Support and resources for small businesses and entrepreneurs** scored **34%** (+1 ppt), but **65% of residents had not heard** of the County's existing **small business programs** and only **17% were definitely aware**. This points to a communications and outreach opportunity that could produce impact without requiring new program development.



Survey Methodology

The current cycle of the web-based Community Survey collected survey data between January - March 2026. Respondents were digitally recruited (e.g., over social media, mobile apps, websites, and survey panels). These ads are targeted to residents, and responses are only included in the data when a local valid zipcode is provided.

Respondents who self-reported being under 18, who declined to provide any demographic information, or those who provided an invalid zipcode are excluded from the results.

1003 valid respondents participated in the web-based Community Survey during this cycle.

Representation

Zencity ensures broad demographic representation in several ways:

Before data collection, Zencity employs national statistical data to establish response targets. These targets are defined based on race/ethnicity, age, and gender.

During data collection, we track the demographic composition of the survey responses in real time, comparing them to the predetermined targets. We fine-tune our distribution and advertising strategies as needed to target all demographic groups.

After data collection, Zencity employs an industry-standard statistical technique called rake weighting. This assigns a unique weight to each respondent based on their demographic characteristics. This method ensures that the distribution of these characteristics in the final weighted sample aligns with the community's overall demographics.

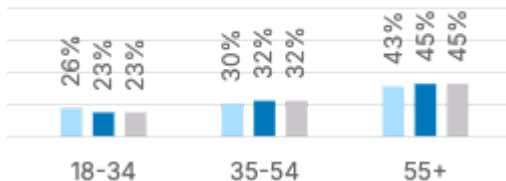

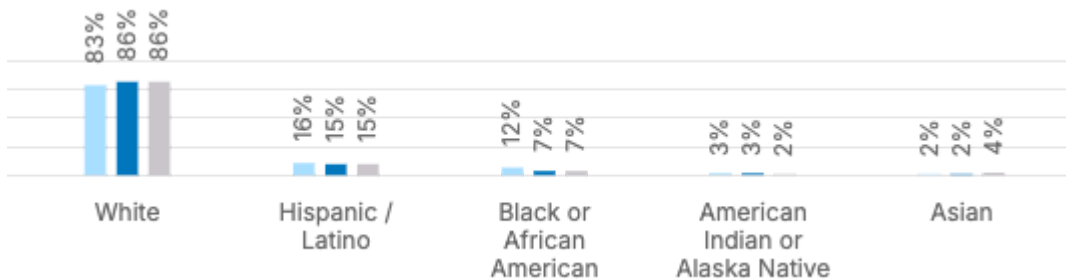

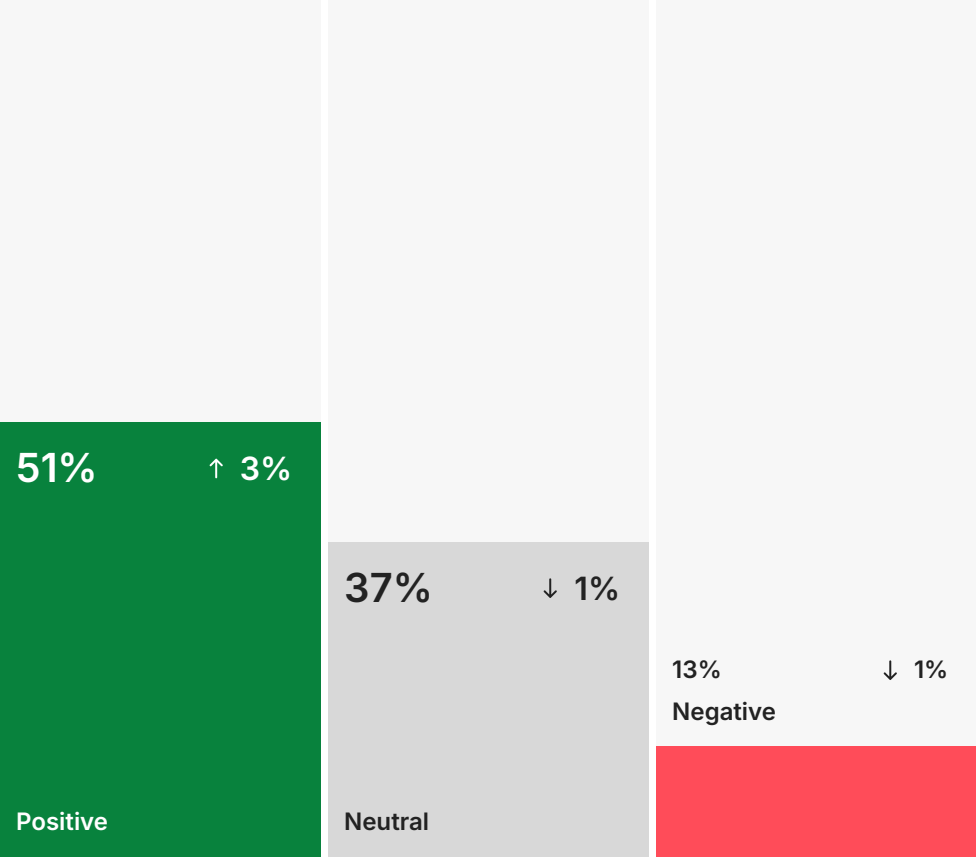

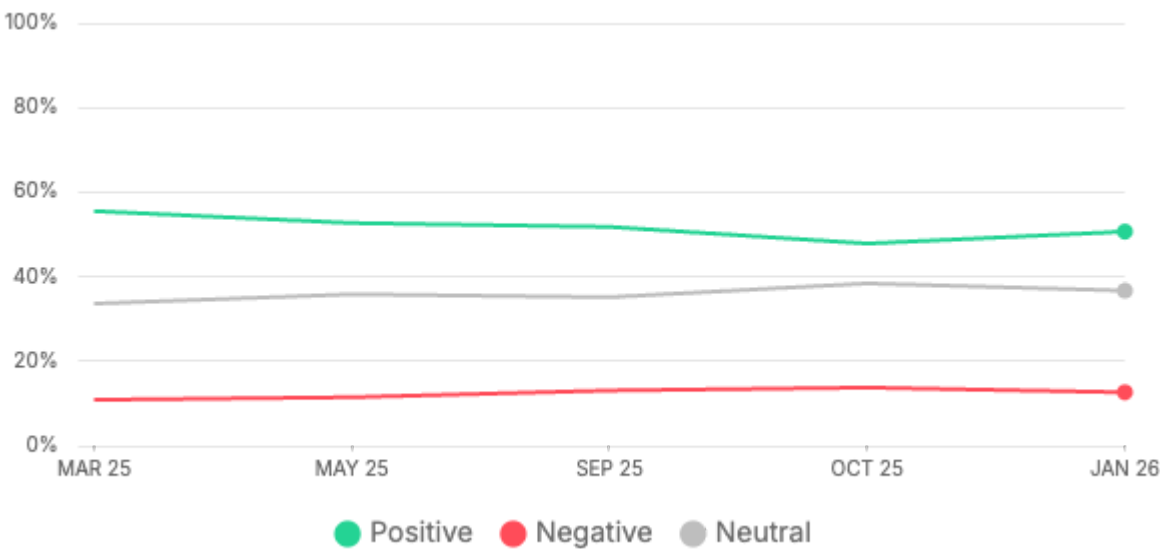

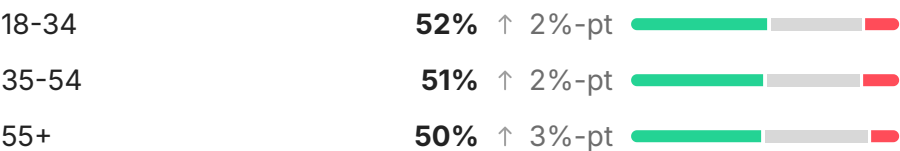

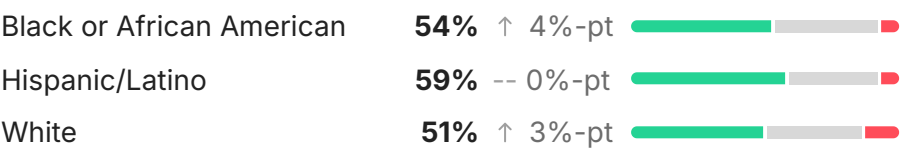

Priority Matrix

The Priority Matrix helps prioritize community characteristics by plotting them based on resident satisfaction and their impact on quality of life.

X-axis (Satisfaction): How residents rated each community characteristic.

Y-axis (Impact on quality of life): How strongly each characteristic predicts overall quality of life (calculated using statistical analysis, not direct resident input).

The matrix divides all community characteristics into quadrants using median values for both satisfaction and impact scores, ensuring a balanced distribution across all four categories for strategic prioritization purposes.

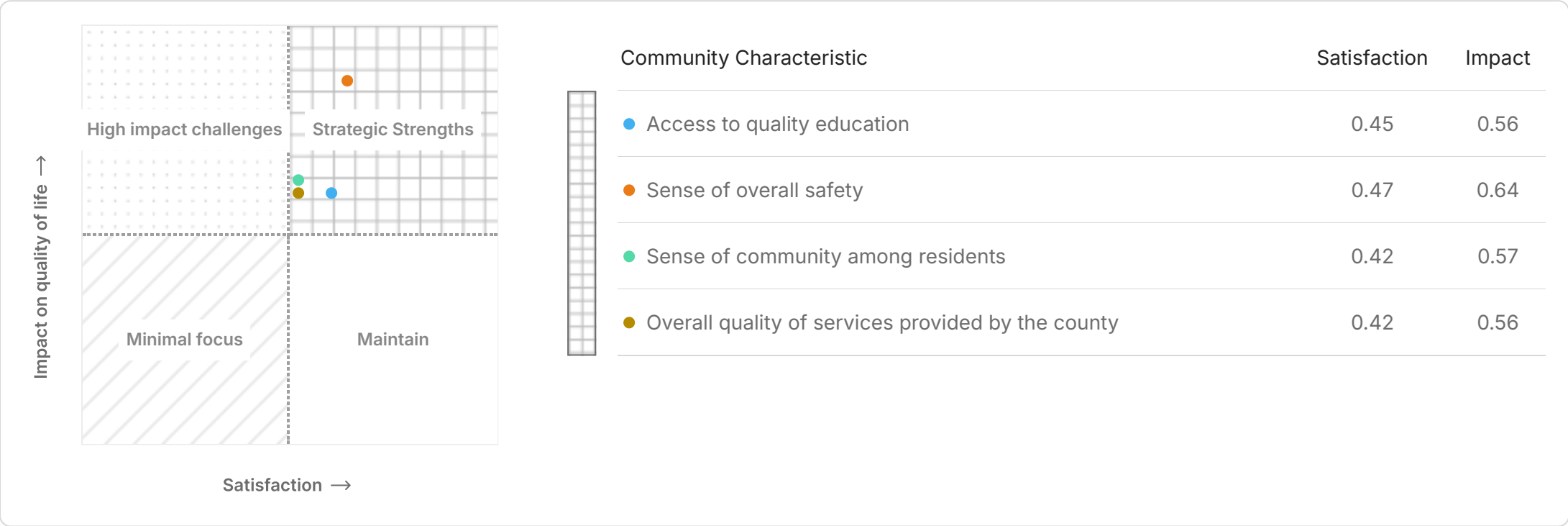
High Impact Challenges (Low satisfaction, High impact)

These are lower satisfaction areas that significantly affect residents' lives and community well-being; as such, they are high-impact challenges that should be prioritized.



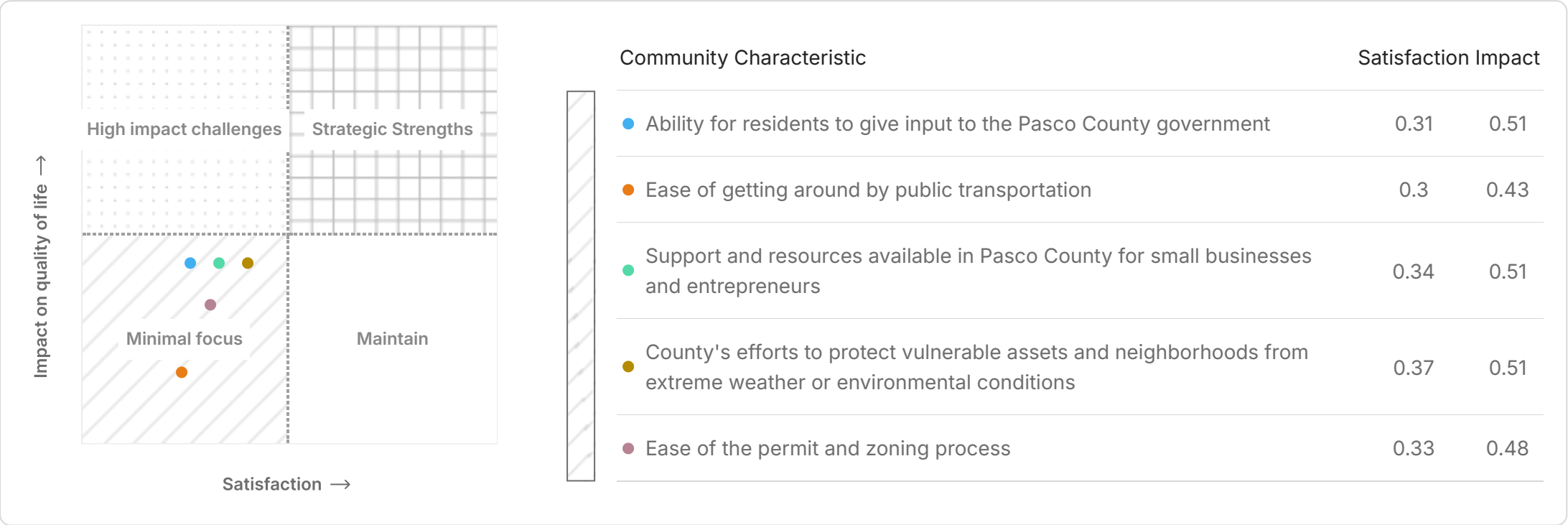
Strategic Strengths (High satisfaction, High impact)

These are characteristics that residents value highly and are satisfied with. Maintain or leverage these as community strengths.



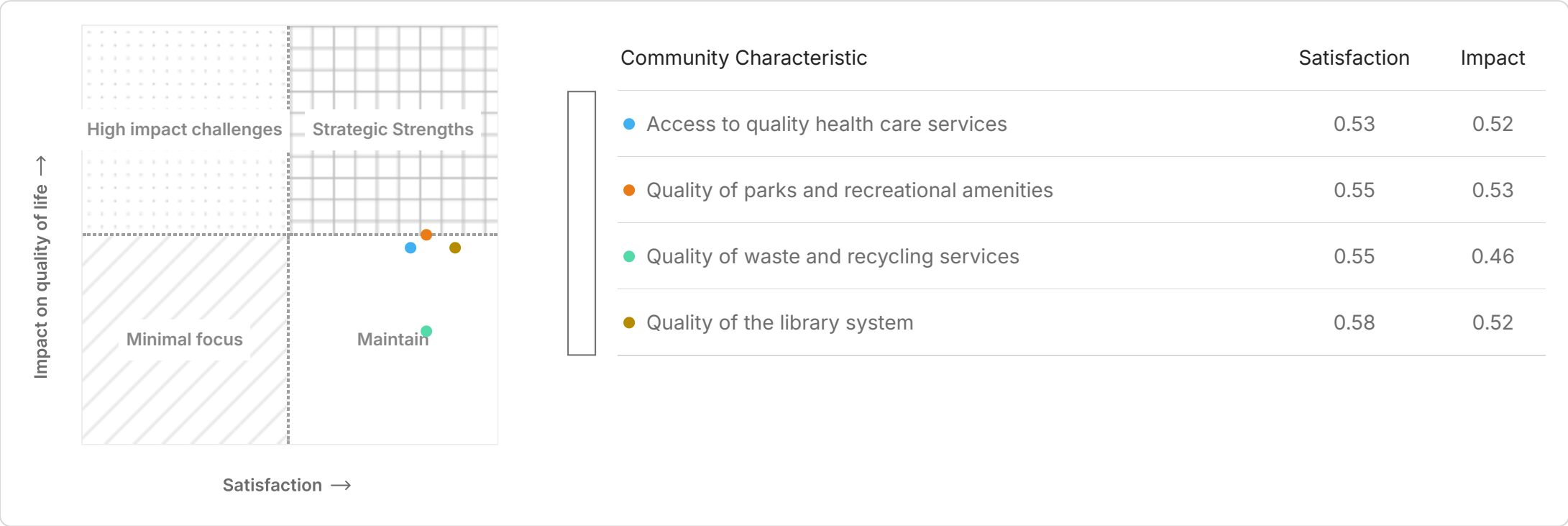
Minimal Focus (Low satisfaction, Low impact)

Community Benchmark

We aim to help Zencity clients understand their results and put them into context. To that end, we will compare Pasco County's results to the United States as a whole and against communities with similar characteristics such as size, population density, and region (their "cohort").

These cohorts help to distinguish patterns unique to each client from those that are common in similar communities.

How we compare Pasco County to other similar communities

Creating the cohorts

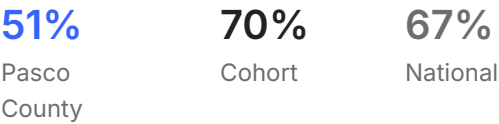
First, all cities, towns, and counties in the US--not just Zencity clients--are put into cohorts based on geography and demographics using a method known as cluster analysis. This method balances a range of different characteristics to put communities into cohorts that are statistically similar to one another. The result of this step is one set of cohorts for cities and towns and a second set for counties.

We chose this method to create objectively similar groups of communities with respect to characteristics that are likely to be correlated with answers to the survey questions. By creating cohorts of larger sets of communities we have found that our benchmark baselines tend to be more reliable than they would be if we had direct comparisons of a small number of communities. Creating cohort scores and national benchmark scores

The Zencity National Benchmark Survey is conducted semiannually, collecting about 5000 responses across the country. The cohort scores are the weighted average of scores for respondents in each cohort. These weights are calculated to match the client's own demographics, to make them directly comparable to the clients' scores. National scores are calculated in a similar manner.

The overall quality of life in Pasco County is 19% lower than its cohort and lower than the national score.

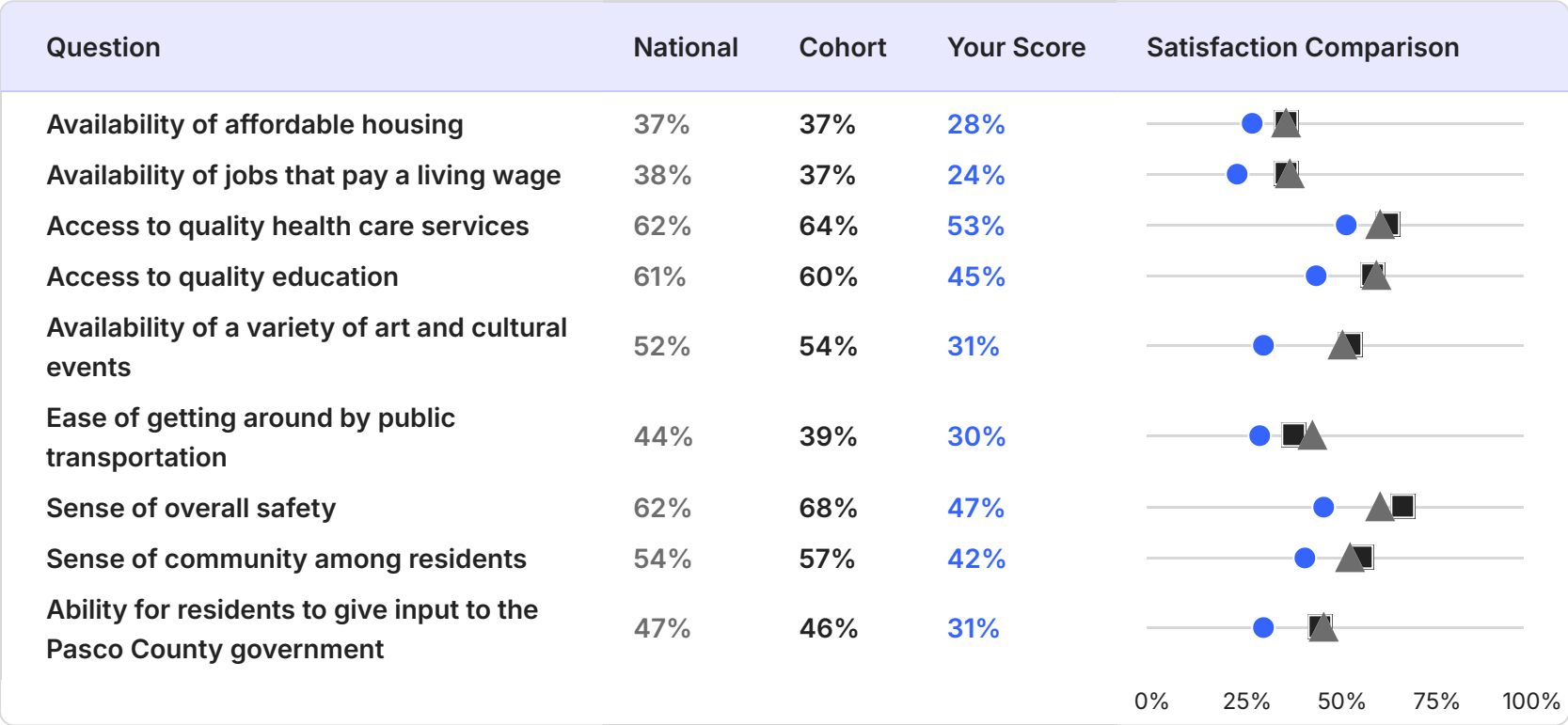

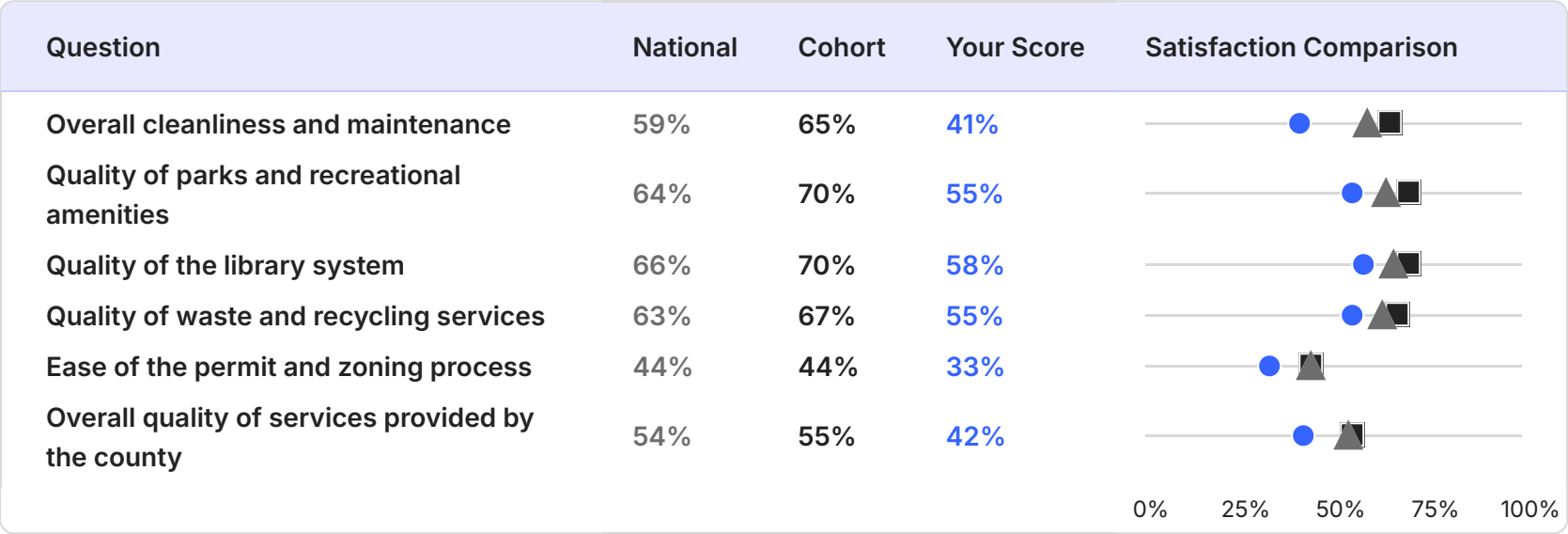

To ensure comprehensive information, responses that have been flagged as invalid (e.g., under 18, missing demographic data, or invalid zip codes

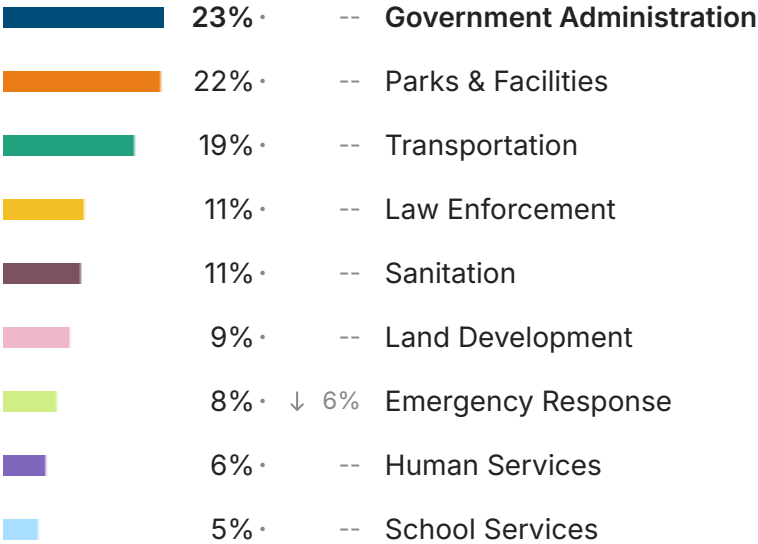
but claiming residency in Pasco County), as well as responses collected through self-distribution efforts, are analyzed in the free-text responses but excluded from the quantitative results.

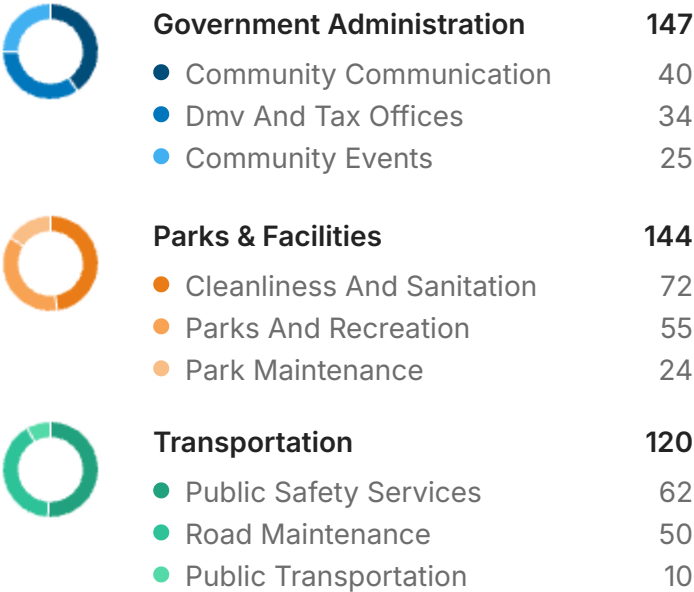

Number of responses by leading subtopic

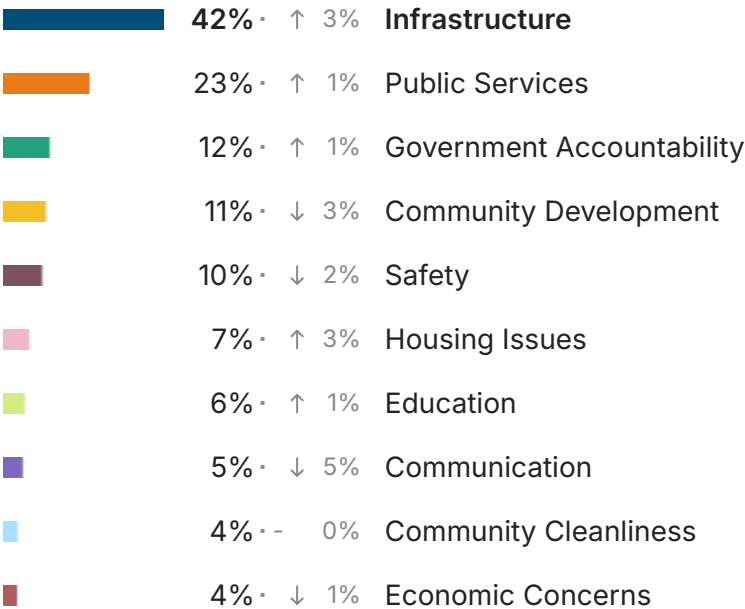

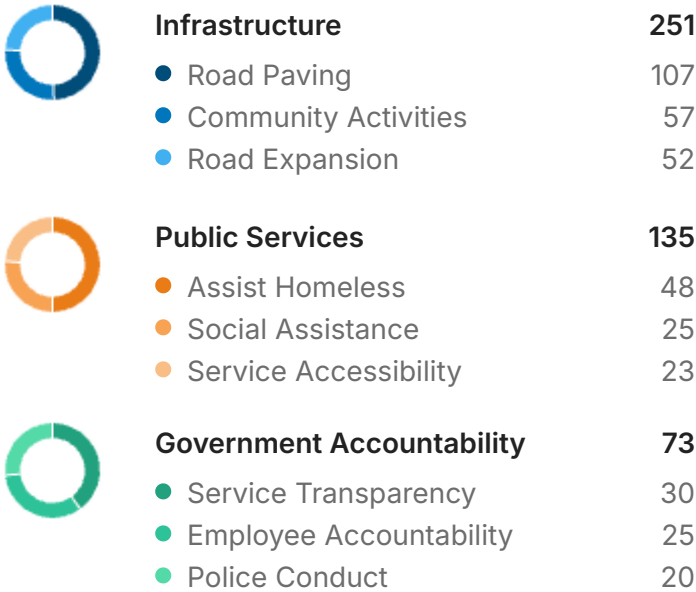

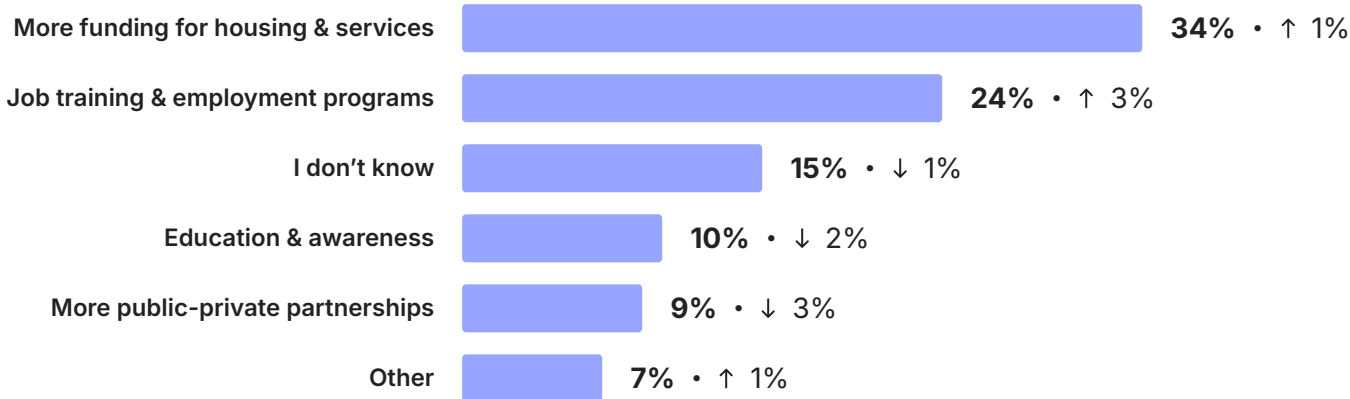

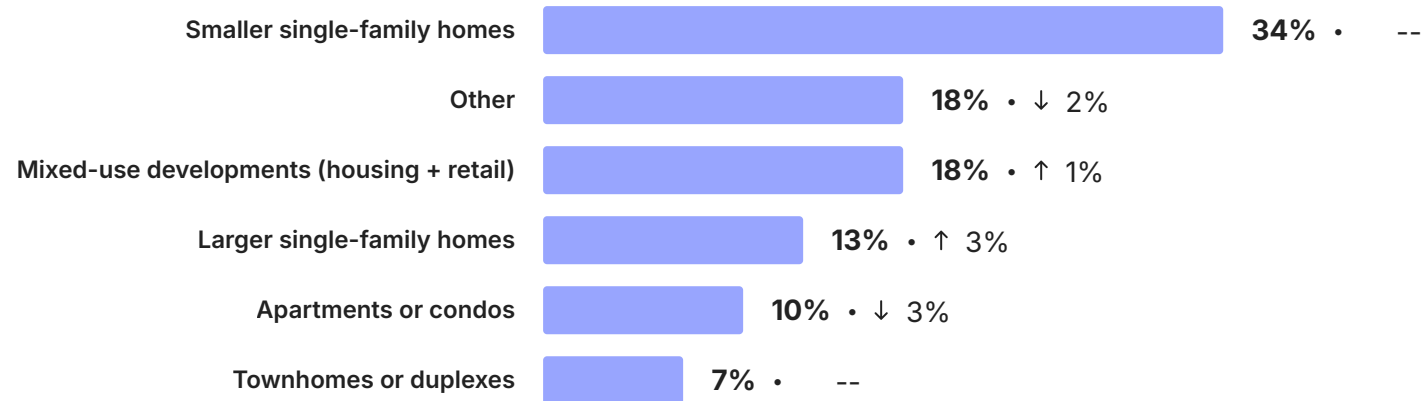

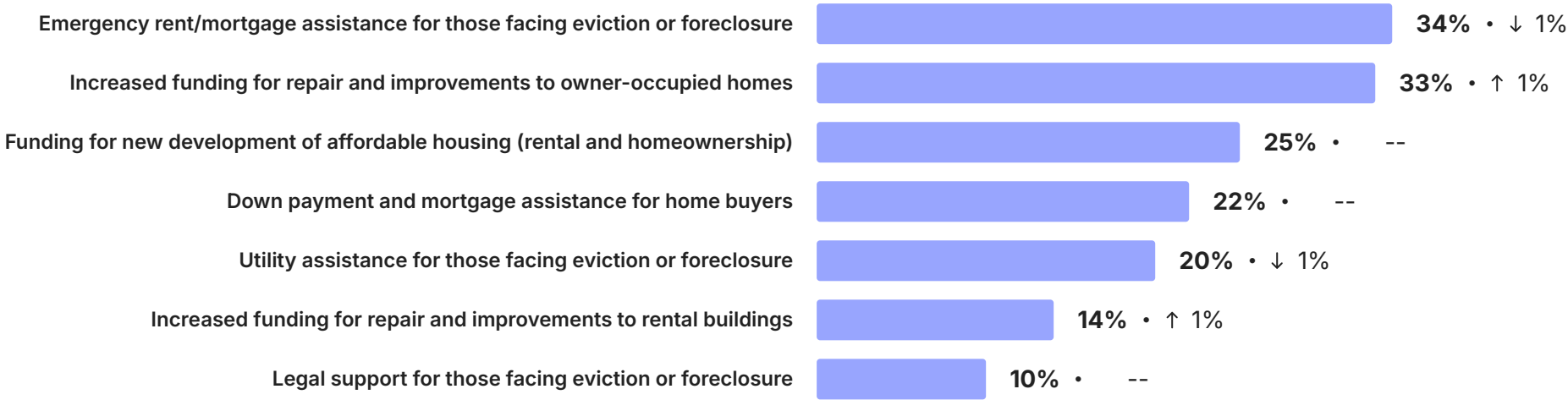

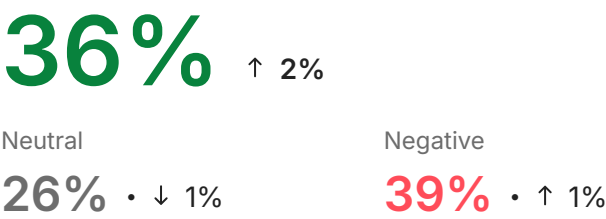
